

IF I AM HAVING AN ANAPHYLACTIC ALLERGIC REACTION, PLEASE FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS.

STEP 1: Make sure I am lying down with my legs slightly elevated or sitting up if my breathing is difficult.

STEP 2: Use EpiPen®. Instructions are on the device.

STEP 3: Dial 999 immediately, ask for ambulance and state 'anaphylaxis'.

STEP 4: If my symptoms have not improved or are worse, 5 minutes after using my EpiPen®, use my second EpiPen®

I should stay lying down or if I am unconscious, I should be placed in the recovery position. Stay with me until the ambulance arrives.

Reporting of side effects

If you get any side effects or have a device failure, talk to your doctor, pharmacist or nurse. This includes any possible side effects not listed in the package leaflet. Please report side effects or device failures with any medicine or vaccine to the medicines regulator MHRA through the Yellow Card Scheme.
