#### **EMTRICITABINE/ TENOFOVIR DISOPROXIL FOR PrEP REMINDER CARD**

#### Front

You have been prescribed emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil for PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis) to help reduce the risk of getting HIV-1 infection. For this medicine to work effectively it is important that you don't miss doses. The recommended dose is one emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil tablet each day. Take emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil exactly as your doctor has told you.

Whenever possible, emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil should be taken with food.

To help you remember to take emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil:

- You can make it part of your routine, for example taking it with your lunch, or when you brush your teeth after breakfast. It is important to find a time that works for you.
- You can add a reminder to your mobile phone or any other device that can alert you
  when it is time to take emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil.
- You can use a small weekly pill box and put in the necessary tablets every week.
- You might also find it helpful to use the calendar to tick off each day after you take
  emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil. Starting in your first week, tick the day when you
  start emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil, then tick the relevant box every day after you
  have taken emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil. You can also make note of the date
  when you took the first emtricitabine/ tenofovir disoproxil tablet from a new bottle.
