## Infections

- ENTYVIO increases the risk of getting infections.
- Infections may progress more rapidly and be more severe.  
*This may include serious brain and nervous system infections.*
- You should not be treated with ENTYVIO if you have a severe infection.

If you develop symptoms suggestive of:

- infections for example fever, persistent cough, weight loss, listlessness, or;
- **nervous system problems** for example confusion, difficulties with vision or movement then you should seek medical attention immediately.



Keep this card with you for 4 months after the last ENTYVIO dose, since side effects may occur a long time after your last dose of ENTYVIO.
