- This patient is being treated with tremelimumab, which is associated with immune-mediated adverse reactions (imARs)
- Immune-related adverse reactions (imARs) may appear at any time during treatment or months after its discontinuation
- Early diagnosis and appropriate management are essential to minimise potentially life-threatening complications
- Consultation with an oncologist or the patient's usual healthcare team may be helpful for management of imARs

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# What to do if you suspect a side effect, even if it is not listed in this card or the Patient Leaflet

- If you experience any side effects, contact your healthcare team and seek medical attention immediately
- DO NOT treat any symptoms yourself before talking to your doctor
- Talking to your doctor is important and they will want to know about these side effects. you will not be bothering them

Symptoms that may appear mild can quickly worsen if left untreated.

# Possible Side effects

#### **EYES**

- Yellowing of whites of the eves
- Eve sensitivity to light - Blurred or double vision

## CHEST

- Chest pain
- Irregular or fast heartbeats
- Difficulty breathing
- New or worsening cough
- Fast and deep breathing
- Sweet smell to breath

### STOMACH AND BOWELS

- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhoea
- Feeling less/more hungry
- Constipation - Severe stomach pain
- Blood in stools

#### MUSCLES AND JOINTS

- Persistent or severe muscle pain. weakness or paralysis
- Stiff shoulders, neck or hip
- Pain, weakness and paralysis in the hands, feet or arms

### SKIN

- Yellowing of skin
- Rash and/or itching
- Unexplained bruising or bruising more easily than normal

### GENERAL

- Fever
- Persistent or unusual headaches
- Confusion - Dizziness
- Evassive thirst
- Extreme tiredness
- Swollen leas
- Dark urine
- Change in the amount and/or frequency of urine
- Unexplained changes in weight
- Different odour to urine/sweat
- Sweet/metallic taste to mouth
