

PATIENT SAFETY CARD



Important safety information for patients receiving Epysqli™ ▼

Show this card to any doctor involved in your care.

▼ This medicine is subject to additional monitoring. This will allow quick identification of new safety information. Healthcare professionals are asked to report any suspect adverse reactions.

Epysqli can lower the ability of your immune system to fight infections, **especially meningococcal infection, which requires immediate medical attention.** If you experience any of the following symptoms, you should immediately call your doctor.

If you cannot reach your doctor, go to an Accident and Emergency department and show them this card.

- Headache with nausea or vomiting
- Headache with a stiff neck or stiff back
- Fever (raised temperature)
- Rash
- Confusion
- Muscle aches with flu-like symptoms
- Eyes sensitive to light



Seek emergency medical care immediately if you have any of these signs or symptoms and show this card.

Even if you stop using Epysqli, keep this card with you for 3 months after your last Epysqli dose. Your risk of meningococcal infection may continue for a long time after your last dose of Epysqli.

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Information for the Treating Doctor



This patient has been prescribed Epysqli (eculizumab) therapy, which increases the patient's susceptibility to meningococcal infection (*Neisseria meningitidis*) or other general infections.

- Meningococcal infections may become rapidly life-threatening or fatal if not recognised and treated early
- **Evaluate immediately if infection is suspected and treat with appropriate antibiotics if necessary**
- Contact prescribing doctor (below) as soon as possible
